
TEENS AND THE NEWS

8th and 9th graders from the LFM answered a survey on the news. Are students interested in the news? Let's find out.

To the question about where the students get their news from, we learnt that only a few people get it from the newspaper. Most people get their news from the TV and from Social Media. Only six students out of twenty get their news from the Radio.



We can see that half of the students sometimes read the news and a quarter of the students rarely or never watch the news. So, the majority of students read, listen or watch the news even if only half of the students say they like the news. Unfortunately, only 10.5% of the students verify if the news are true.

We also asked if the students watch the news alone, with their siblings or parents. Seventy-five percent of them watch it with their parents, half of the students watch or read the news alone and thirty-one percent with their siblings.

We can see that all the student's parents watch or read the news

As for the language the students watch or read the news in, most of them watch the news in Spanish, thirty-seven and a half percent watch the news in French, thirty-one percent in English.
